	We will be writing a response to literature this week. The main focus will be on plot analysis. The students will need to find a story that they enjoy that has a true beginning, middle, and end. It must have a problem that needed to be solved. Tomorrow, I will be assigning the graphic organizer to get their thoughts in order for writing. Today, choose a story and re-read it if necessary. Upcoming information for you: I asked the students to think about their Who, What, When, Where, and Why questions to support their thinking while writing their response. When they write it, it must be legible, well written, and in complete sentences that make sense. It must flow and be easily read. Most of the spelling must be correct. They will turn in a final draft which means that they may have to write this more than once. Be prepared as many of the students don't like to write it the first time. If at any point this week, you want
	to send it to me for my "notes" to the students for enhanced writing, please feel free to send it as we go.
