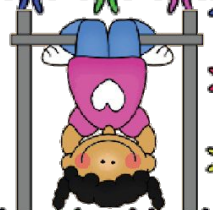
are small and don't take up much space but make HUGE differences for those in need.

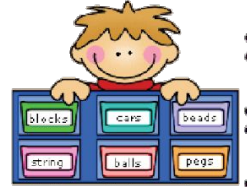
