With our story this week, Cinderlad (Unit 6, Lesson 3), the spelling words are tricky and the little ones will need to practice them a little more to cement them into memory. For the story, the children will need to know about a few characters (Rebecca, Dad, Lars, King, and Cinderlad). He will need to be able to describe the character in one word. They will also need to be able to retell the story from Cinderlad's point of view (pg 150 on the comprehension test). My advice would be, and I will also be working with them in our meetings, is to start taking notes now for this portion of the assessment. I am also going to try to set up a few individual sessions this week so that I can check Oral Reading Fluency and work with them a little on the Multiplication piece of math. I will set up a "Sign-Up" for you to be able to pick a time that works for you and your family.

I am eternally grateful to you for your patience and understanding in trying to find the right balance for you, your family, and the school.
