Reading:

• Day 1-5, pgs 169-174 (white copies) can be done as they kids desire. We should be on day 2 today.

- Online Use Open Court Reading and complete some of the "assignments". Today would be Unit 5, Lesson 5, Day 2. They can be done in any order and at the bottom are "assignments" that I have been adding for the children.
- Read "D is for Democracy" in hardcover book. Answer the questions at the end of the story. We will have gone over these during our Zoom lesson so I expect complete sentences when answering.
- Worksheet pg 137 (U5, L5 Vocabulary) This will work with our vocabulary words for this week.
- Worksheet pg 143 (U5, L5 /oi/ spelled oi and _oy)
- Spelling City is also available for Spelling <u>and</u> Vocabulary practice.

Writing:

- I would like for the children to continue writing a quick summary of their day as we continue this little adventure that we are on. This will be a daily assignment. What did they do? How did they feel about it? What stood out as a great part of their day? (Reader's Digest Version)
- We will also be doing a "book report" very soon so be thinking about a story you like that you would like to film another "commercial" on. I will attach the rubric to the e-mail for your reference when thinking about a book. Can you meet the expectations of the rubric? If not, choose another one.

Social Studies:

- Choose one of the passages sent home (bookmark was included to help support reading of non-fiction). If you would prefer, I can assign one daily. If that works for you, today will be Ruby Bridges.
- Project coming up think about some of the things you have learned in reading our stories over the past five weeks. It can be a concept or a symbol. More information tomorrow...

Science:

• Take this opportunity to look around your yard and see if you have a place to plant something. It can be a small space; it just needs light.

Math:

- Skip count by 2's, 5's, 10's, 25's.
- Lesson 6: Page 447 Use a Calendar The children should be proficient in this. If your child struggles with this, please let me know.
- *If you made the clock, you can use it to practice telling time.
- Also, it was brought to my attention that on SCDiscuss, under Tumble Books there is a story called It's About Time, Max. You and your child can read this book and practice their time skills by using the clock you made or another analog clock that you can move the arms on. As a bonus, it is also an AR book!!! Thank you Mrs. Lindroth!
- Homework pgs. 99, 101, and 103 can also be completed to review our learning from home.
