Again, the "assignments" that I am sending daily are suggestions. When we return, I will assess each student on these topics and see how they do. If re-teaching needs to take place, I will do so. If not, we will progress as if we never missed a day. Please do not allow "school time" to be a dreaded portion of your day. We will all adjust as we need to. We are meant to adapt and change as we grow and this is definitely an opportunity for us all.

As we continue to "roll with it", our typical schedule on Wednesday is as follows:

Again, these are suggestions and attempts to continue learning as we navigate these uncertain times.

Reading:

- Online Use Open Court Reading (login cards were in the packet) and begin some of the
 "assignments". Today would be Unit 5, Lesson 4, Day 3. They can be done in any order and at the
 bottom are "assignments" that I have been adding for the children. I cannot see what the kids see so
 if you find this to be redundant, please let me know.
- Worksheet pg 111 (Making Inferences) Some of the students were having difficulty with this. We
 worked so hard on finding information in the text that inferring was problematic.
- Day 1-5, pgs 163-168 (white copies) can be done as they kids desire. We should be on day 3 today. I
 did forget to add it yesterday and it helps support our reading skills for the week.

Writing:

 We are working on summaries so I would like for them to write a summary at the end of the day about their day. What did they do? How did they feel about it? (Reader's Digest Version)

Social Studies:

 Choose one of the passages sent home (bookmark was included to help support reading of non-fiction). If you would prefer, I can assign one daily. If that works for you, today will be Barack Obama.

Science:

• If you did not do the "commercial" yesterday, I would like for you to do it at some point. I would LOVE to see them!

Math:

- Skip count by 2's, 5's, 10's, 25's.
- Lesson 2: Page 435 Time to the Hour and Half-Hour
- If you made the clock yesterday, you can use it to practice telling time. Be sure to talk about the hour and minute- hand. A strategy that I found that seems to work for remembering which hand is which is short-hand is the hour hand (smaller hand, small word). The longer hand is the minute hand (longer hand, longer word). For half-hour's the hour hand should be half-way between the numbers. Example: 1:30 The hour hand should be half-way between the 1 & 2 and the minute hand should be on the 6. For minutes, we can either memorize the placement of the hands and the time associated with it or we can count by 5's to figure it out.
